LARRY BERGLIND

Larry Edward Berglind died peacefully on September 26, 2023. He was born on July 16, 1940, to Victor and Lillian Rishoff Berglind, in Waukon Township, Minnesota. A graduate of Shelby High School, in Shelby, Montana, Larry kept his childhood friends throughout his life.

He met Ann Cartwright at Idaho State College, in Pocatello, where he joined Sigma Phi Epsilon. Ann and Larry were married in 1962 and moved to Bozeman, Montana, where he finished his degree in Electrical Engineering at Montana State University. His career was in design and sales. In the highlight of his career, he worked with and sold digiquartz pressure transducers internationally, some of which are used today in offshore buoys to warn of tsunamis. Amidst those achievements, however, at the age of 55, Larry chose to retire, recognizing that his true devotion was to being a great husband, father, and friend.

To his wife Ann, Larry's devotion showed itself every day of their 61 years of marriage. With his career taking off in Minneapolis, Minnesota, in 1966, he moved his young family to Bellevue, Washington, and started attending Saint Andrew's Lutheran Church. Together, they traveled throughout the United States, Canada, Mexico, Asia, and Europe. They shared many years of adventures with family and friends, sailing the Mahina and crewing race boats. Cooking and bridge interests formed several cherished friendships.

Larry was proud of his two sons: Jeff and his wife Kim, their children Jenny and Josh, and Jim, his wife Sandy, and their children, Isaac, Zachary, and Julia. He taught them a passion for sailing and how Lefse and Norwegian cookies are made. He was firm in his principles and supportive as they began to pursue their own ways. He encouraged but never steered. He taught them to serve with integrity and hold true to important values like faith and family.

To his friends, he was an optimistic, quiet, and kind soul who had a unique ability to relate to people from all walks of life, always valuing character. He was a compassionate listener, a source of consolation, and above all, a true friend.

Larry will forever hold a special place in the hearts of all who knew him, leaving a legacy for so many of us to be better fathers and mothers, husbands and wives, neighbors, and friends.

If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.

Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.
