DAVID GRINDELAND

David Bruce Grindeland died peacefully at home on April 24 with his beloved wife Sherry at his side.

Born in Grand Forks, North Dakota, he graduated Phi Beta Kappa from the University of North Dakota with a double major in physics and math.

After college, David began his engineering career in California, where he met Sherry at a college-and-careers group at church. They married in September 1963, and then lived in Germany while David was stationed there on active duty with the Army Corps of Engineers. They returned to California before eventually moving to Bellevue in 1973. David worked at Sundstrand Data Control (later called Allied Signal and then Honeywell) as an aeronautical engineer.

He and Sherry loved playing bridge, particularly as partners which is sometimes unusual for married couples. David claimed Sherry could read his mind. (She could but not just about bridge.) They enjoyed traveling, and Hawaii was a favorite destination. David was quick with a smile and a shaggy-dog story, returned change if a cashier gave him too much, and helped others at every opportunity. He loved used-book stores, garage sales, flowers, Seattle's sports teams, Lil' Jon restaurant, meatloaf, and scalloped potatoes. David was a longtime Saint Andrew's member who enjoyed singing in the choir over the years.

He was an avid fan of television, particularly C-Span, city and county government channels, and news programs – when he wasn't watching Westerns, Marilyn Monroe movies, or sports.

David is survived by the love of his life, Sherry Grindeland; their children Susan Lulu (Aschenaki), Geoff Grindeland (Debra), Leauri Moore, and Katie Grindeland; their grandchildren Taitu Lulu, Desta Lulu, Gareth Grindeland, Tad Grindeland, Sophia Lopes, David Lopes, Duncan Goddard, and Devin Goddard; and two great-grandchildren, Camila Gutierrez and Gaia Torres.

If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.
