# NATASHA NIEMAN

Natasha Joy Nieman was born on a sunny spring morning, April 1, 1999, in Bellevue, Washington to parents Mark and Andrea Nieman. As Natasha grew, she was an inquisitive, curious and intelligent child. Natasha tested into the highly capable program for her 4th grade year and continued to excel in her studies through her graduation from Baylor University in 2023.

Natasha graduated Kentridge High School with honors in 2017. She was accepted into the Human Services program at Western Washington University in the Fall of 2017. Natasha worked as a resident dorm assistant at Western and mentored college students in the dorms. Natasha graduated Western in May 2019 with honors and her Bachelor of Arts in Human Services.

Natasha decided to take a break from college studies to go on youth mission to Europe for 6 months in January 2020 and planned to travel throughout Europe, but due to covid restrictions that went into place, she remained in France for the duration of the trip. She enjoyed her time exploring France with other youth on mission.

Natasha returned home from France to Washington in June 2020 and took a position with Alaska Christian College as a Resident Supervisor for the 2020/2021 school year in Soldotna, Alaska. This position was instrumental in Natasha choosing student life as her career path.

Natasha was accepted at Baylor University in Waco, Texas for the 2021 school year to pursue her Master's Degree in Higher Education while interning 20 hours a week serving international students in the Global Engagement studies program.

Natasha began applying to colleges to pursue a Residential Student Supervisor position in April 2023 and was offered jobs at various colleges in Washington state and Texas. She chose a Residential Housing Supervisor position in Stevenson South Hall at Washington State University in April 2023 and had planned to start her career there serving students in July 2023. Natasha graduated Baylor with honors in May 2023.

Natasha was a very loving, generous and accepting person. She had a heart for serving those in need of mentorship and guidance. She was diligent about checking in with friends and family from wherever she happened to be in the world. Natasha consistently made a positive difference in the lives of others.

Natasha passed away in a car accident the afternoon of June 30, 2023, along with her father Mark on the way to Washington State University to set up her apartment for her position which was to start July 11th.

Natasha loved spending time with her family and friends and her college sweetheart Quincy, Travel, Hiking, Music, Concerts, Art, and Disneyland. Natasha was loved by many and her light will shine forever.

# MARK NIEMAN

Mark Richard Nieman was born September 9, 1969 in Burien, Washington to parents Richard Nieman and Stella Nieman. He had two older sisters, Phyllis and Diane. From an early age, Mark proved to be extremely intelligent and had an uncanny ability to learn about the world around him and how things worked. Family legend says he once took apart an alarm clock and put it back together when he was 3.

Mark graduated from Newport High School in 1988 and was accepted into Washington State University. He took on several activities such as marching band where he played trombone, and was on the WSU fencing team. He graduated from WSU in 1993 with a degree in mechanical engineering and a minor in math. Mark met his future wife Andrea Cole in 1993 and the couple was married in 1995. They had two daughters, Natasha born April 1, 1999, and Noelle, Born May 29, 2003. Mark and Andrea were married for 20 years.

Mark began his engineering career at Abacus Consulting in Seattle, where he worked for 5 years before transferring to the McKinstry Engineering Firm in Seattle where he worked for nearly 26 years. Mark was very passionate about his job and eager to lead his teams to create the most sustainable and effective future for energy consumption. Mark worked on numerous engineering projects in Washington state.

Mark was an endlessly selfless, humble, caring, and hard-working person. He never bragged about his intelligence, instead using his knowledge to quietly benefit others. He would do anything for his family and provided for them with a big smile, always striving to do the very best for his loved ones. No matter the issue, if an appliance needed to be fixed or mouths needed to be fed, Mark would jump at the chance to help.

Mark passed away in a car accident on June 30, 2023 along with his daughter Natasha on the way to Washington State University to set up Natasha's new apartment. She had received a job at the college as a resident supervisor and would have started on July 11th.

Mark had a slew of passions, collections, and hobbies, including but not limited to, LEGO, listening to a wide array of musical genres, concerts, Japanese culture, bass guitar, puzzles of all kinds, space exploration, video games, tracking time, and collecting calendars. He absolutely loved the color blue, and his favorite animals were hamsters and otters. Mark is deeply loved and missed by everyone he impacted and will never be forgotten.
