Summer Worship

But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To him be the glory both now and to the day of eternity. Amen. 2 Peter 3:18

As our program year comes to a close, we are already looking ahead to the series and themes that we'll use in worship during the summer months. This year, we'll have a total of three series covering a range of themes using readings that are mostly familiar, and also some that you may not have heard in a while. Each of the series will allow us to examine both the original context in which they were written, as well as how they apply to us today.

To start, we'll explore Creation Care using readings from the Old Testament and the Psalms. In this series, we'll not only read the first creation story in Genesis, we will also give thought to humanity's relationship to the various aspects of creation – such as the sky, water, and animals. In our consideration of the current climate crisis, we will read stories from Leviticus and Ezekiel about environmental devastation and renewal, paying particular attention to how they echo in the later books of the New Testament.

Our second series will focus on Samuel and part of the history of biblical Israel. Beginning with God calling Samuel, we'll explore Samuel's role in biblical Israel's history, including Israel's desire to have a human king as their ruler instead of God. We'll read about the anointing of Saul, who serves as the first human king. And we'll conclude with the story of young David killing Goliath, a story that many of us haven't heard since Sunday school.

We'll conclude our summer readings with the familiar "Bread of Life" series from John's gospel. In chapter 6 of John, Jesus presents some difficult teaching to those who would follow him. After many of his devout disciples walk away, Jesus asks the twelve if they also wish to leave; to which Peter answers, "Lord, to whom can we go? You have the words of eternal life."

We are also very excited to announce that on Sunday, August 25, we will participate in an outdoor worship service with the other ELCA congregations in our cluster! More details on this are coming soon.

As we move into the next season of our church and calendar years, may our worship together deepen our relationship with scripture and with God.

Collin has been working hard in school and made the President's honor roll with a 3.89 GPA so far.







Bellevue Church Steering Committee

Another meeting of the Bellevue Church Steering Committee was held on Saturday, April 20. We heard each of the sub-groups report on their progress in their various areas of focus: 1) Governance, 2) Finance and Staffing, 3) Missional Outreach.

Bill Brueggemann has agreed to take on most of the leadership of the Finance and Staffing work so that Tom Getzinger can pivot to exploring how we can increase our missional impact by collaborating through music. He will be working with the Missional Outreach team led by Jean Wahlstrom.

Pastor Lara and I will be hosting an after-service Forum in May to provide an update on the collaboration work, answer questions and seek input. The date is **May 5**. It would be great if you can join us!

PorchLight Men's Shelter - June

The Congregation Council has approved a request from Porchlight (formerly Congregations for the Homeless) to have the men spend the evenings at Saint Andrew's for the month of June. You likely recall that, in the past, they most often joined us in March. They have asked that we switch our host month to June going forward. Kurt is in full agreement with this as heating costs will be lower in June.

Building Improvements

The Building and Property Committee has come forward with a request to fund repairs to the soffits, eaves, and possibly the roof where internal gutters have failed. You have likely seen large amounts of water running off the corners of the roof of South Hall during heavy rain. This has been going on for several years due to the deterioration of the internal gutter system. The repair is critical as the longer the situation exists, the more damage is done.

Council readily agreed that this repair is critical and directed that money from our Building Maintenance reserve will be used for this repair.

The Building and Property Committee also asked that we consider replacing the water heater, urinals in the men's bathroom, and the galvanized piping that serves the bathrooms and the water fountain in the Narthex. The piping has deteriorated to the point where there is very little water pressure. The drinking fountain no longer functions and the conditions in the men's bathroom are very unpleasant and unsanitary.

Council very much supports this plumbing repair and upgrade, but decided to hold off authorizing the work until the repairs to the soffit and roof are completed. At that point, we will have a clearer picture of how much money will be required.

Semi-Annual Congregation Meeting

Comments

Cash flow is still positive (more income than expenses) by \$2,961 for the year due to exceptional giving in January. However, income in February and March income was less than the \$67,000 per month needed to meet expenses. This trend of negative cash flow each month is consistent with our history; but it would be nice not to depend on extraordinary giving at the end of the year to meet budget. Please consider making your pledged contributions earlier in the year.

Northwest Washington Synod

From Bishop Shelley Bryan Wee

I have a confession to make, I am a terrible pool player. I am so bad that the last time I played, the person I was playing with stopped the game and said, "You are the worst pool player I have ever played with." (I had told him I was horrible but he didn't believe me.) I'm using this story as a very thin tangent to talk about gifts and the Spirit ... bear with me.

In Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, chapter 12, we read, "Now there are varieties of gifts but the same Spirit, and there are varieties of services but the same Lord, and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good."

As many of you know, Paul was writing to a congregation in Corinth after receiving some correspondence from them and hearing their concerns. Throughout this letter Paul emphatically makes it clear that no one is spiritually better than others – no one has better faith, no one has better gifts, no one should eat better than another at the Eucharist table. Paul is adamant in this. (He is talking about this because of some struggles in the Corinth church. You are welcome to read the entire letter of 1 Corinthians to get more context.)

Paul emphasizes that because we all receive faith through the Holy Spirit, no one is spiritually superior. Paul further emphasizes that because we all receive a variety of gifts given by the Holy Spirit, no one has a worthier gift than another. And, to emphasize this point, Paul writes that the Spirit does not give only one kind of gift to all. Because the church and the world need diverse gifts, the Spirit gives different gifts to different people. In other words, Paul is simply saying this: same Spirit – lots of gifts.

You hear this? In a society where we emphasize certain gifts and skills and abilities above others (and often feel like we have fallen short), we hear in 1 Corinthians that the Holy Spirit gives a variety of gifts to a variety of people. Specifically, YOU have been given a variety of gifts, and this is good.

Further, these Holy Spirit gifts – they are not meant to benefit the individual person but are to benefit the entire community and world. Paul emphasizes that these gifts are not to be used in selfish ways or in self-seeking ways. Paul clearly states that if a gift cannot be shared, and shared for the good of others, it is not from the Spirit. Ultimately, the purpose of these different gifts of the Spirit is to share in God's love and grace and mercy with all through Jesus Christ our Savior.

As Americans, we have often been told (and maybe believe) that as individuals we are responsible for ourselves. We are not to rely on others – we are to be strong and self-sufficient. We are taught that to have freedom is to be autonomous. But let's be clear. This is far from what we read in 1 Corinthians. Paul says each person receives gifts for the common good. Paul says that each person receives the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. It is in community where the gifts from the Holy Spirit shine. It is in community where the Holy Spirit is made manifest.

You see, it is God's intention that we are to be with one another – for one another – as the community of faith, as the body of Christ, as the Church on earth. The Holy Spirit has given a variety of gifts to a variety of congregations and individuals. And together we are called to bring these gifts together to help bear one another's burdens, to love and pray together, to bring justice and new life, to be made manifest in the Holy Spirit for the common good.

Honestly, it doesn't matter that I am a terrible pool player. But it does matter how I both share the gifts that God has given me and how I reach out to others in mutual support when I am in need.

I would love to hear stories from you about your gifts being made manifest in the Holy Spirit – individually and in your congregation. How are each person's gifts being shared in your own particular congregation? How is your congregation sharing with another congregation? What gifts were missing from your particular place of worship that you have found outside of your space? What gifts have you been able to share with others?

May we live into what we often say in worship, "The gifts of God, for the people of God." Amen.

- Contact Cheryl Jurrus to be on the planning team and help set up the areas they will be using. Thank you for supporting this ministry and helping the men go on to employment and housing.



S aint Andrew's Lutheran is once again participating in the KidVantage (formerly called Eastside Baby Corner) 10th Annual Diaper Derby. The event runs from <u>May 3 to June 7</u>. This is our 5th year "racing."

In 2023, 37 participating companies and organizations collected more than 127,000 diapers for kids living in our community. This kept babies dry and healthy while also removing a serious barrier to stability for families. However, the need has been greater than what donations brought in so every diaper counts!

How the Derby Works:

- Diaper Derby starts May 3 so don't donate until then!!!
- Points are attached to each diaper donated and for packages of wipes. The larger sizes (size 4 and up and well as pull-ups) are most needed.
- Each "race horse" is in a race with like-sized organizations so we aren't competing against Microsoft or other mega-stallions. We have a chance to be the best in our class!

MaaSAE Girls Lutheran Secondary School (MGLSS), Tanzania

Pre-Form 5 Program

A round 30% of the Maasai girls are lost to forced marriage and early pregnancy when they return home from the ten month break between Forms 4 and 5. For years, OBA has been contemplating a way to keep the young ladies on campus, rather than traveling home and risking all of their hard work. This year, a generous OBA donor funded a new program for the young ladies. 53 out of the 63 Form 4 graduates are currently participating in the Pre-Form 5 program! In the Pre-Form 5 program they are learning cooking, sewing, and computer skills. The girls really enjoy the computer program, but when they were asked what else they would like added to the program, the majority said art and design. In the future we plan to ask the sponsors to help support this program by donating \$400 during the 10 month gap.

Candidates

We recently learned that **Neema Melami Laitayock** ran in the last election and plans to run in the next one. **Upendo Malulu Ndoros** also plans to run in the next parliamentary election. Both of these women were in the very first classes, active in leadership activities, and sang in the choir. After earning a bachelors degree Neema returned to MGLSS to teach English for several years.

Prayers

A SPECIAL PRAYER REQUEST for the 33 Form 6 students who will be taking their national exams this month. The results will not be known until the fall. This determines if any can go on to university or vocational training. After exams they will participate in 3 months of national service, required of all Form 6 graduates.

Kafika House, Tanzania

In March they opened KAFIKA HOUSE **MOSHI** where the focus is on children with spina bifida and hydrocephalus. Their mamas stay with them on site enabling a different model of care for a longer healing journey. Sarah, the Director, met with Cure Children's Hospital in

Kenya who provide surgical care for children living with disabilities. She also visited Bethany Kids who provide training to pediatric surgeons. She also joined the Tanzania Management and Development for Health team to further rehabilitation services, developing Basic Standards for Specialized Rehabilitation Hospitals organized by the Ministry of Health. KAFIKA HOUSE is taking their place alongside the people shaping Tanzania's rehabilitative health plans and policies. These relationships are key to expanding the ministry of KAFIKA HOUSE.

While Sarah has been off site making connections, the surgeons, nurses, and anesthetists of One World Medical Relief returned, were transforming the lives of 55 children with cleft lip and palate, masses, and burn scar contractures. All these medical personnel volunteered their time and talent to surgeries and training. We praise God for the gifts of healing and thank you for your support of the unique work of KAFIKA HOUSE.
